Roeland celebrates its 50th anniversary

"Celebrating Christmas in the middle of summer and a visit from The Queen: everything is possible at a Roeland camp"

WAKE UP! A bunch of sleepy kids looks around in a daze while Christmas music blasts from the speakers. Not an unusual scene, except for the fact that it happens in the middle of August. The students make their way to the breakfast area while chattering cheerfully but when they enter, they fall silent for a moment. A dazzling Christmas tree is shining, Christmas music is playing and a cosy fire is being projected on the wall.

A visit from The Queen

This is a classic at a Roeland camp. Every day revolves around a theme and we put in our best effort to make it happen. The staging of a little play is the icing on the cake and it really kicks off theme day. One of the activity leaders gets wheeled in on a cart. He is wearing a dress and a bathing cap. The children anxiously await what will happen next. None other than 'The Queen' starts giving a speech.

I think that's one of the best things about volunteering at Roeland. Every day is a new adventure, and the staff members have what seems to be boundless creativity. In just one week, we cloned a dinosaur, then brought it to life; we dressed up as dragons and superheroes, my hair got dyed in red, we painted another activity leader from head to toe, first in green and later in orange. We built a campfire and sang songs, dressed up our head of logistics as a mermaid (he was very happy with that, by the way) and we even solved the murder of Spiderman.

Friends for life

In just one week we made friends for life. Soon we will reunite, to have game evenings and dinners. We still send messages now and then, saying we miss each other and to be careful when toasting a slice of bread (there may have been a little smoke detector accident). We have had incredible evenings accompanied by a nice fifth meal, and as a group we became ever so close.

Skilful speakers

In just one week we have seen students evolve from shy to skilful speakers. According to the Roeland principles, they are only allowed to speak English. They learn in a playful way and are being diligently adjusted, and that's when the magic happens. The children pick up a lot of words and grammar without realizing it during the lessons and activities. They must use the English language to work together to escape from mazes, try to steal an egg from a dragon or to solve an escape game. In addition to the lessons and activities, they also engage in science labs and all kinds of experiments (many eggs were sacrificed in the process).

In just one week we had the time of our lives.

Roeland camp types

Discovery – Non-Immersion

At these camps, you are allowed to speak in your mother tongue some of the time). The camp coaches will use the target language (e.g. French during a French camp) throughout the camp, thereby helping you to learn as many new words and sentences as possible. In order to make sure that everyone can follow along easily, each day features a 'bilingual moment', when the activities will be explained in both the target language and your mother tongue. During the language workshops, you will be divided into small groups according to your level. The focus on language continues throughout the other activities as well, however. This ensures that you are able to express yourself much better in the target language by the end of the week!

Roeland Classic - Immersion

The Roeland Classic sticks closely to Roeland's well-known formula for success. Participants are fully immersed in the target language, and are expected to speak only the target language throughout. The team are all either native speakers or speak the target language (almost) perfectly. They will do everything in their power to help you to express yourself in the target language. There is no shame in making mistakes, it is part of the process – we just want you to try your best! For the language workshops, you will be divided into small groups according to your level. By the end of camp, you will even be dreaming in your target language! These camps are perfect for anyone who wants to have lots of fun whilst also making huge progress.

Experience Camps - Immersion

A language is only truly learnt by experiencing it. This is the approach we take on our Experience Camps. There is less of a focus on language workshops. Instead, the target language is learned by speaking and hearing it all the time. Led by our group leaders, you will be holding debates, exploring a city, learning a new (adventurous) sport or letting your creative side go wild – all in the target language. Although there are fewer (or no) language workshops on these camps, our group leaders will focus on helping you to improve your skills and express yourself better in the target language.

Registration

Registration opens on Saturday 7 January 2023 at 9am on our website www.roeland.be.

An 'A' for 'Ambience'

Everyone participates in the group activities, but your voice counts as well. And if something worries you, there is always someone on our team ready to listen. Our volunteers are always there to help you out.

"The more languages you master, the more friends you will make"

Aline (age 9) and Thomas (age 11) went to a Roeland Junior English camp in the summer of 2021. It was their first visit, but because of their dad they had known about Roeland all their lives. "Aline took her first steps at camp, and Thomas was still a baby when I brought him along", says proud dad and Roeland volunteer Gilles Van Der Planken.

Gilles has been a volunteer at Roeland for 16 years, mainly at the Dutch camps for teenagers. At first, Gilles teamed up with a babysitter who would take care of his children while he taught, but nowadays Aline and Thomas are old enough to participate themselves.

How did you experience your first camp?

Aline: "Technically, I was still a little bit too young to be allowed to participate in a Junior English camp. But my older brother went, and because I already accompanied Daddy to his camps for so many years, I was allowed to come as well. I really liked it, but it wasn't always clear to me what the teachers were saying."

Thomas: "The first days it was difficult for me as well, but halfway through camp it went much better and I understood the larger part of the conversations. And if something wasn't clear, the teachers explained it repeatedly and patiently, even with a lot of gesturing if necessary."

What did you learn at camp?

Thomas: "I learned the numbers, how to read the clock, the days of the week, ..."

Have you also played games?

Thomas: "We played football with an oversized ball, we played tag, a game called 'switching chairs', miniature golf..."

Aline: "... And we spent a lot of time at the playground. I really liked the location. There was plenty of room to romp around and build a camp."

What is the difference between a language lesson at school and a language workshop at camp?

Aline: "For me at my age, it was not that different. In the classroom we also did a lot of singalongs and storytelling.

Thomas: "At school I have to take a test every week, but at camp I learn in a playful manner."

Why do you think it is so important for your children to speak multiple languages, Gilles?

Gilles: "In my opinion, if you just speak one language you probably won't achieve your full potential in life. The more languages you master, the more friends you will make around the world."

"The strength of Roeland is defined by the commitment of the teachers. They take the children step by step through a new language by means of immersion, a 'language bath' so to speak. It's a method our teachers use to help the children develop their linguistic skills with the vocabulary they already possess.

Can you tell your English has improved?

Aline: "Yes! Before the camp I only knew a few words. Now I can already speak in sentences."

Are you going to become a teacher like your dad when you grow up?

Aline: "I don't know yet. I am too young to decide on that right now."

"Being immersed in a foreign language is an amazing experience"

"Bilingualism is a huge asset. Especially if you live in Brussels, like I do", Maëlle Pierlot says. In 2021 she went to the Dutch camp 'City and adventure', in Ghent.

Maëlle: "My parents encouraged me to sign up for a language camp. Roeland vzw has a partnership with HR Rail, the social service of the railroad companies NMBS and Infrabel, where my dad works. We perused the catalog together. I was immediately interested in going."

Did you learn a lot at the language camp?

"At the camp, the teachers always encourage you to speak in the foreign language, even if it is still new to you. Fortunately for me, I already had a basic knowledge of the Dutch language. And if a word slipped my mind, I could always resort to describing it."

"Despite my passable knowledge of the Dutch language, I have picked up many new words and grammatical constructions. I use what I learned at camp when I talk to my Dutch-speaking friends. Even the students who were not yet very proficient in Dutch made a lot of progress during the camp."

What are your best memories of that language vacation?

"I especially loved the kayak trip and the outings to the city center of Ghent. Since I was appointed to the older age group, we were allowed to have a say in the activities we could do. We also organized a casino evening by ourselves. That was great fun, too."

What is the difference between the language lessons at school and the language workshops at a Roeland camp?

"Language lessons at school are a tad too slow for me because we often repeat the same things. Being immersed in a foreign language for thirteen days is a completely different approach. You learn a lot fast, consciously and subconsciously."

"I really like the Dutch language. To be able to use it in a big Flemish city was a very uplifting experience."

Picking up a language in a creative fashion: that is how we do it at the camp!

The motto of Roeland is "Creatively learning languages". But what does that mean? And how is this adage being put into practice? We ask Pauline De Baets, Vice General Coordinator, and Tom Vandevelde, Head of Didactics. Together they set out the didactic course at Roeland.

Immersion: effective use of communication in the target language.

When you have Roeland in mind, you think about immersion. Why this method?

Pauline: "Our immersive angle proved its effectiveness, for more than 52 years now. In comparison to a normal week at school, we involve our students actively by submerging them in the language of their choice for the duration of the camp.

Tom: "The exercises are linked to specific situations, so that our students can use their newfound knowledge straight away. A language workshop about vegetables and fruits is usually followed by a visit to a grocery store, where the participants pick and buy whatever ingredients they need for dinner preparation."

Pauline: "Or, at the start of the day, they learn the necessary vocabulary to join and play a big game later that day. I can assure you: there is no lack of motivation there!"

Can such an approach be too intimidating sometimes?

Pauline: "We do everything we can to keep the treshold for speaking in a new language as low as possible. We provide a logic trajectory, starting with 'initiation' camps, all the way up to 'experience' camps. At Junior camp (age 9-12) en at some of our Teen camps (age 12–14) the children are allowed to speak to one another in their own language. We organise the rest of our camps (for children above 12) in accordance with the immersion method.

Tom: "Our teachers are often native speakers, so our youngsters have practically no other option than to speak the language they signed up for. And that is what it's all about: making mistakes is very much allowed, you just must keep trying! The teachers use only the target language and do whatever they can to help our students find the right words. After a language camp our participants often think or dream in French or in English. This can only mean one thing: mission accomplished!"

Pauline: "The focus of our specific language workshops evolves together with age groups and language level, to bigger overarching projects. Our +15 group in Chémilly cooks, lives, and discusses topics in a charming vacation house; the +16 camp from 'Langley on Stage' rehearses a beautiful stage play for the local people, and the +14 students take to the water at Osmington Bay."

Learning in a playful manner.

Tom: "And now it's about time we show the ace up our sleeve: a playful approach. Our students go about the language amusingly, but these fun and games are supported by a well thought out and scientifically sound method. Expanding someone's vocabulary can just as well be achieved by letting teams engage in vocabulary-enriching games like 'Time's Up!'. A little spark of competition kindles motivation, and you can rest assured: our students leave the camps with an expanded vocabulary. For example: we design escape rooms where spelling and grammar are the keys to get out, our participants write and fine-tune dedicated songs, they solve a Cluedo mystery from a multilingual angle, and so on...

Pauline: "...and stories are not just being told: our students turn these tales into small stage plays for which they write the script, design the costumes, and create the set pieces.

You're obviously aiming high. How do the teachers deal with this kind of expectation?

Tom: "Believe it or not, but they are the ones urging us to do so. A lot of our volunteers are professional language teachers. In the course of a year, we organise multiple training workshops for our teachers, all moments of opportunity to brainstorm and look at our teaching objectives from a fresh angle. It's a perfect way to pick up all kinds of inspiration, for our camps but also for their professional occupation.

Optimised for our students.

Pauline: "We also prefer a high student-teacher ratio. For every five students we provide one teacher. That is why we firmly believe in Roeland's uniqueness. The teachers mingle with the students and engage in conversation. It's a proven way to forge a bond of trust between the students and the teachers, and a perfect environment for honing newfound language skills.

Tom: "The teachers get to know the youngsters well with a relaxed vibe as a result, so the students feel more at ease to speak freely. Our language workshops consist of a small number of participants to guarantee a personal approach, tailored to the students' needs. The teachers interact with the children based on their knowledge of the target language, their talents, and preferences. For example: we organise camps where the youngsters take turns having a say about how the day will look like. That sounds great, doesn't it?

"I don't know what you guys did yesterday, but my daughters were very excited and happy when they got home. A sincere thank you!", or: "I wish to thank you for what you are doing here. Brighton is picking up new words really fast and he really wants to be there!". These are some of the parent's reactions we received after just one week of Taalzomer, this year. And therefore, we love to volunteer.

I am Jana, 29 years, and I work as a volunteer at vzw Roeland Taalzomer. About 6 or 7 years ago I had the opportunity to join an NT2 camp during the Easter holidays for a day, via someone I knew. I developed a real taste for it from the start. At first, I was an activity leader but, soon I became Head of Project Taalzomer. And I still am, for several years now.

Lifelike Twister

At Taalzomer, we try to show children of different origins who have only recently arrived in Belgium an unforgettable 3 weeks of summer while we teach them how to speak Dutch. This is not done in a traditional way, but we teach through activities, creative assignments, ... We play lifelike twister to practice the colors and body parts, we go to the market for a food-and-drinks theme, we organize a fashion show to learn about clothing, ...

Harry Malter

Every Wednesday we take the children on a field trip. The first week we usually go to Harry Malter, which is always a success! In the morning the children walk around in groups among the animals and in the afternoon, they enjoy themselves at the playground. The unfavourable weather conditions last summer didn't stop them from having a great time!

Show moment

At the end of each week, we show the parents what the children have learned, so we organize a show moment for them. These can be very moving; it is fantastic to see how fast the children make progress and to hear the pride in their voice when they say things in Dutch.

Thankfulness is the predominant feeling that stays with me after Taalzomer, both from the participants and the parents. We notice that the children are very happy to join and that we reluctantly part ways after 3 weeks of Taalzomer. The appreciation from the parents kindles a warm feeling that stays with us for a long time.

"A summer without Roeland would not feel like a real summer"

If memory serves me right, I started going to Roeland language camps when I was 8 years old. Now - 20 years later - I'm still going. I can't imagine a summer without Roeland, really.

Another language

Signing up for a Roeland language camp means expressing yourself in a language that is not (yet) your own. At French camps or English ones alike, no one was supposed to speak Dutch.

From my first French camp as a junior, I remember being extremely nervous because I feared my knowledge of the French language would be insufficient to survive a language vacation in style. But the enthusiasm of the animators and teachers lifts you gently out of your comfort zone, to let you learn as much as possible. Afterwards, I realized I had picked up an amazing number of new words and sentences from that camp, which gave me a head start in school the following year.

Sports and games

What makes a Roeland camp especially cool is that in addition to the lessons, sports and games are at the very center of the activities. Up to 2 hours of sports are a part of the daily program. That's how I went wall climbing for the first time in Marche. At the English language camps, I also learned how to play cricket. Weather permitting, water games are also a part of the deal. Even if your clothes get a little dirty and wet, it's a great way to have a lot of fun.

Stratego at the English language camp in Langley is still one of the coolest games that I remember playing. The whole camp was divided into four teams and almost the entire area was the playing field. As a team we had to try to capture the flags of the other players as quickly as possible.

Day trips

Field trips are an inextricable part of each camp as well, in addition to the daily lessons, sports activities and games. It's a great way to get fully immersed in the language of your camp. On these trips you also engage in something that you would normally not do by yourself. The coolest trip I can remember was a visit to the city of Cambridge. That day we saw one of the most prestigious schools in the world: Cambridge University. We also went 'punting' (travelling on a river in a narrow, flat boat), an experience that will stay with me for a very long time to come. Thanks to Roeland I was given the opportunity to collect a lot of wonderful memories.

Volunteer

After my last camp at the age of 18, I thought I had to part ways with Roeland. But luckily this was not the case. Three years later, friends I had met at a Roeland camp had no trouble convincing me to join up as a volunteer. So, in the summer of 2015, I went to Cottesmore for the first time.

Originally, I was planning to join as a volunteer for just one year. Now, 7 years later, I am still a volunteer at the Roeland camps, and I could not imagine a summer without it. I can honestly say the people I've met here are friends for life. When the camp weeks are behind us, we still meet up on a regular basis.

Roeland Social Projects

Since 2008, Roeland has been organising day camps for foreign language newcomers. The target group is children and young people who have recently arrived in Ghent. The children learn Dutch in a playful way and discover the leisure possibilities on offer in Ghent. In this way, Roeland reaches approximately 150 young people of 30 different nationalities each year. In 2017, we received the "Youth Work for Everyone" prize for this project from the Province of Oost-Vlaanderen.

Since 2018, we have also been organising Playful Summer, day camps in Dutch for children with a language delay. This project runs in partnership with Brede Schools Ghent.

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
